The port of Copenhagen and the greater Copenhagen area exist in symbiosis. More than a quarter of all the city's tourists arrive via the port as well as a third of all goods destined for the Danish capital. CMP welcomes almost 700.000 cruise passengers a year to Copenhagen, which means that more than a quarter of all the city's tourists arrive via the port.

Town of Copenhagen is popular among tourists and cruise ships: 325 – 350 vessels a year dock at northern Europe's largest cruise port, bringing passengers from more than 150 nations. The numbers of cruise tourists will grow in the future.

Holiday cruises are currently growing most rapidly and has the greatest potential. To meet this demand, new facilities for cruise traffic will be developed in Northern Harbour, with berth for vessels of up to 350 metres in length.



The new 1.100 m long dedicated Cruise Quay will be ready for season start 2013.

The Quay will be fitted with waste water reception facilities.
